The '**Storytelling in Schools**' project aims to immerse Guinean students in their own cultures through the discovery and practice of storytelling.

With this goal in mind, workshops were organized to train teachers in using storytelling in their teaching, thereby enhancing their narrative skills.

Furthermore, regular storytelling sessions were implemented in schools to directly engage students with traditional stories, thus fostering learning and cultural transmission.

Educational materials based on storytelling were developed and distributed, and creative activities were organized to develop students' creative and expressive skills.

Additionally, storytelling events and festivals were organized, allowing students, teachers, and community members to share and listen to stories, thus celebrating the Guinean oral tradition.

Lastly, to underscore the importance of storytelling in education and cultural preservation, awareness campaigns were conducted, and efforts were made to collect, document, and research Guinean traditional stories to serve as resources for future educational and cultural initiatives.



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
